

Dear Fellow Hams,

Thank you very much for your participation in the 51st Baltic Contest. There were almost 460 of you from 46 DXCC countries. The organizers have got more than 380 paper and electronic logs and it is increasing from year to year.

Well, first 9 slots in mixed entry TOP 10 were taken by LY guys with Albertas LY5R ahead. Algis LY7M made the best score in CW entry and Juri ES5GP was the best among SSB participants in Baltic countries. In two hours entry Andrius LY2TA has won the medal as nobody could beat LY4A team (LY4A, LY2RJ and LY2BKT). Kestas LYR-346 was the only and first in SWL entry.

Among European countries, Oyvind LA8W, was the best with Dmitri UA2F a few points behind of him. Very tight competition was in CW entry. Vasilij UA1AFT won the medal using only 100 watts. The strongest man in SSB group was Jan OZ1ADL and he could be named the most time winner in this entry during all the history. Two hours entry winner – Genadij UD1A. We haven't had big competitions among European teams and the medal was sent to SP6NIC. The title of the best listener goes to Rafal SP7-003-24 this year.

We know it is difficult to compete in BC from countries outside Europe. But it was amazing to get the logs of K1KI, K1VR, K3ZO, K4BAI, N3QE, PU7DEF and even from VK2CCC. And some of them won the first places! Fantastic! This year Andy RD8D was the first in CW entry. SSB medal goes to Gurel TA2AGO, Tim N3QE was the best in E entry and Tomas VK2CCC won SWL prize.

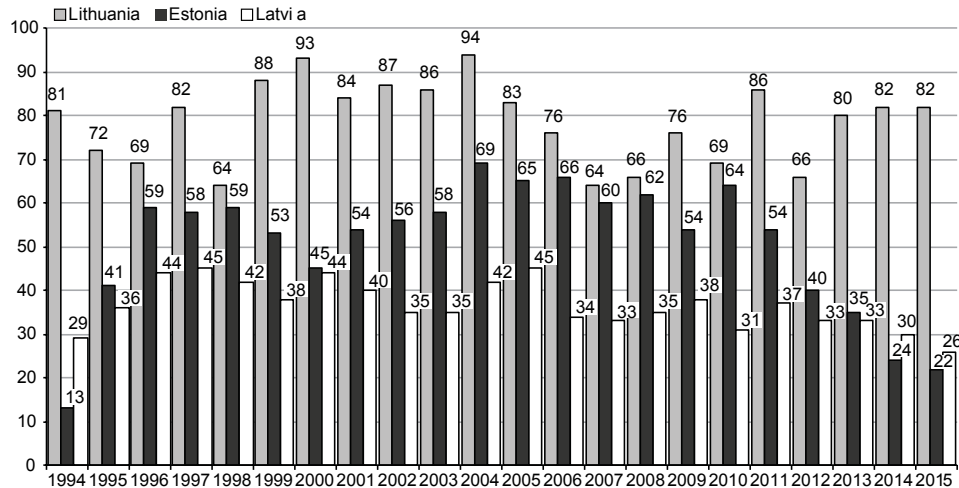

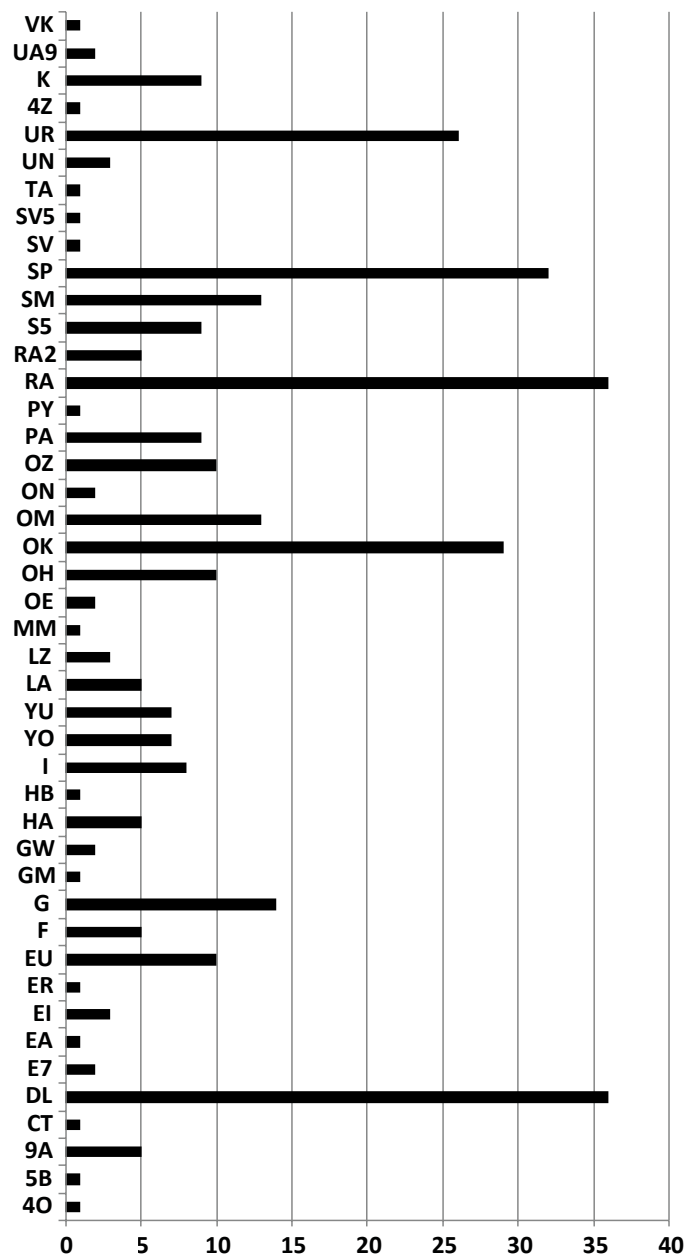

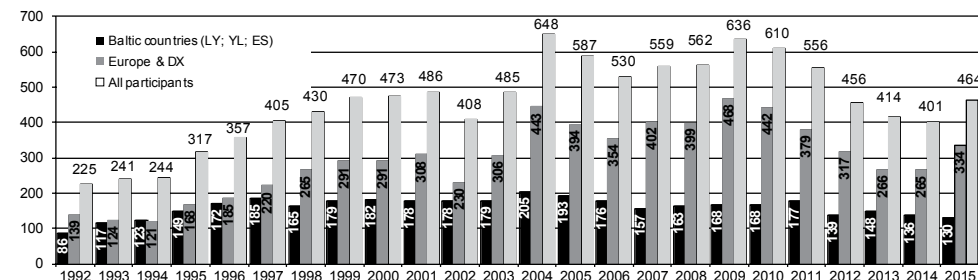

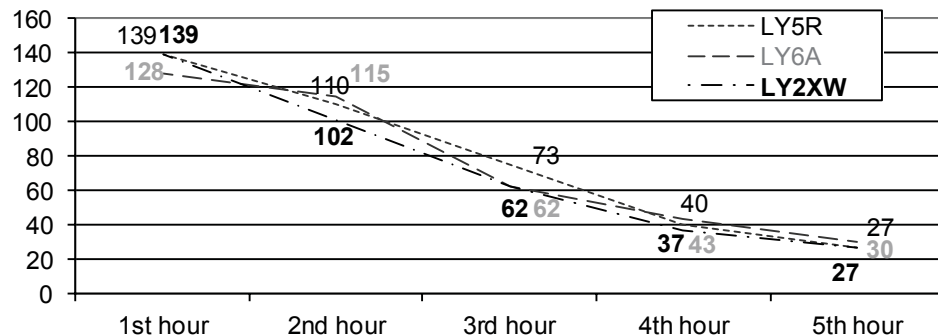

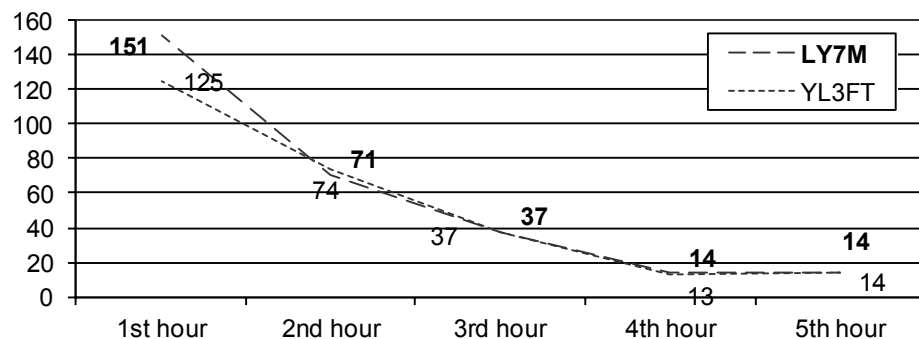
The number of participants in Baltic Contest



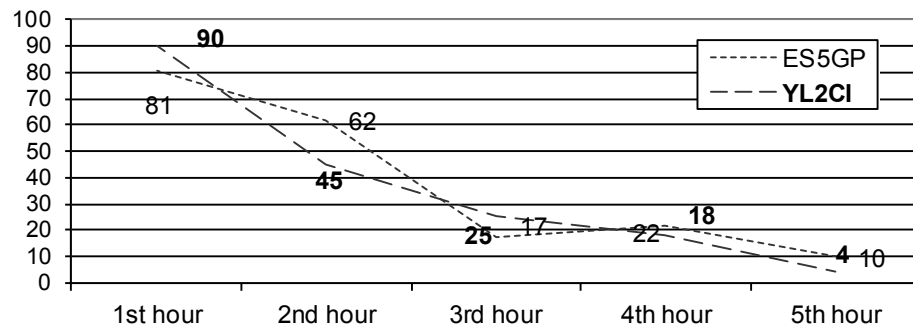
QSO rates of MIX mode leaders

The 52th BALTIC CONTEST 2016

General rules

The Lithuanian Radio Sports Federation has the honor to invite radio amateurs all over the world to enter 52nd Baltic Contest 2016.

1. Aim of the BC: to promote radio sport in the Baltic countries and to expand relations among radio amateurs of the Baltic and the world.

2. The object of BC: to establish as many contacts as possible with amateur stations world wide.

3. Period: from 2100z May 21, 2016 till 0200z May 22, 2016.

4. Sections:
 A – single operator, CW/SSB
 B – single operator, CW
 C – single operator, SSB
 D – single operator, 2 hours, CW/SSB
 E – multi operator, single TX
 F – SWL

4.1. Any use of DX spotting networks (Skimmer, DX cluster, sked pages and etc.) for section A, B, C, D is not permitted.

4.2. Only one transmitted signal is allowed at any time.

4.3. Only one period of two hours with biggest QSO number counts for section D competition, all contacts made outside this period will be automatically used for check.

5. Frequencies: CW (3510-3600) kHz, SSB (3600-3750) kHz.

6. Exchange: RS(T) and serial number starting from 001. Each station may be worked once in SSB and once in CW.
7. Scoring: for participants in Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania each QSO with Europe counts 1 point and QSO with another continent counts 2 points. For participants in Europe each QSO with Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania counts 10 points, each QSO with another participants counts 1 point. For participants outside Europe each QSO with ES, YL, LY counts 20 points, each QSO with another participants counts 1 point. SWL report must contain both call signs and at least one of the control numbers.

8. Final score: the sum of QSO points. When the number of points is equal, the criteria for priority are: for better percentage of QSO confirmation; for more DX QSO.

9. Awards: certificates will be awarded to the leading stations of each section for every country (DXCC) in accordance with the number of participants. Winners in A, B, C, D, E, F sections in the Baltic countries (ES, LY, YL), in the Europe and outside Europe will receive originally designed medals.

10. Logs: Deadline 2016.06.10. Electronic logs should be sent to lrsf@lrsf.lt. Cabrillo file format is preferred. Paper logs should be mailed to LRSF, P. O. Box 210, LT-44003 Kaunas, Lithuania.

The log MUST show the following information: call sign of participant, name, age, entry, power, and QSO in chronological order. Each contact has to have correct time in GMT, frequency (or band), call, report with serial number sent, and report with serial number received. A log without all required information may be reclassified to checklog.

11. Disqualification: If any participant violates contest rules, referees committee can disqualify that participant.

12. Referee committee: Referee committee decision is final and indisputable.

Short rules of LITHUANIAN CUP 2016

Aim of the contest: to clarify the best contesters, to promote radio sport and to increase skill of contesters in on-site competitions.

Participants:

1. On-site participants are single operators only (call signs LY16A - LY16Z). Transmitter power is limited to 10 W. Each participant is supervised by referee during whole contest time. Applications or requests of on-site competitor for more detail information (technical requirements, detail rules, accomodation, etc.) should be sent to organizers (see section Logs). Deadline of registration for on-site participants is 4th of June, 2016.

2. Other participants:

- a) single operator;
- b) team (multi op., single tx).

Time: 11th of June 2016, 1500-1630 UTC in three periods: 1500-1529 UTC, 1530-1559 UTC, 1600-1630 UTC.

Frequencies: 3520-3600 kHz - CW, 3600-3700 kHz SSB.

Exchange: RS(T) + serial number of QSO. Each station may be worked once in CW and once in SSB during each period (max 6 QSO with the same call sign). Please to follow QSY rule (the same as in European Sprint).

Scoring:

1. On-site competitors: 1 QSO = 1 point (no multipliers).
2. QSO with LY16 prefix counts 2 points, QSO with other participant – 1 point.

Multiplier is a number of different LY16 calls during the all contest time.

Awards: winners (on-site, single op. and team) will receive trophies. Certificates will be awarded to the leading stations in every DXCC country. Special awards are for QSO with all on-site participants.

3. In Club Competition Standing, the on-site participant scores are multiplied with on-site competition participant numbers.
